you may start writing and submit your report not less than 3,000 (maximum 4,000) words to get one of **Two Bursaries of RM6,000 each** on one of the following subjects:

1) *The benefits of Reduced or Minimal Impact Logging in Sarawak*

An outline is suggested for formatting the report, however the candidate may use any format desired. The report should be developed through research including the internet, publications, interviews or any other source of information available. The report should include reasoned arguments, conclusions or opinions on the subject. The report will be evaluated on the technical content and not on the correct use of English.

2) *The Potential of Forest Fire to negatively affect the economy and environment in Sarawak*

The report may include the pros and cons of using prescribed in Sarawak and contain the reasoned arguments, conclusions and opinions of the candidate. The candidate has wide latitude on the content of the report as long as it addresses the basic concept of the effects of forest fires in Sarawak. Recommendations on mitigating measures may be included in the report. The report will be evaluated on technical content and not on the correct usage of English

*** This award is a one-time award only but the sponsor(s) may consider offering similar awards in future years.**

Particulars of Registration and Submissions

The selected essay in each subject will be awarded RM6,000 to be used to defray educational cost.

A candidate may elect to submit two technical reports on both subjects for consideration.

Submissions must be in English and may be forwarded electronically, or by mail.

Reports will be judged primarily on their technical content and not on correct English usage.

- Submit your report single spaced in any standard font in a standard electronic format or, if in hard copy, on A-4 paper.
- Be sure we have your e-mail address – we will acknowledge by email each report as it is received.
- Be sure we receive your report on or before August 31, 2006.
- If sent by post you should allow at least two weeks for delivery – an envelope post marked on or before August 15, 2006 will be accepted.
- The evaluation of reports will be at the sole discretion of the sponsors and will not be subject to appeal.
- Funds will be transferred by International Money Order or Bank Draft in Canadian funds based on the International Currency Exchange rate (Olsen's) at the time of award.
