NEW STAFF FOR STA TRAINING SDN BHD

Meranti plywood from Malaysia may be downgraded to the lowest of the durability classes i.e. Class 5 by European Union (EU) if the proposed draft EN636 Plywood Specifications (Foreign Standard) is adopted.

This is a great concern to the plywood trade in Malaysia. At the state level, the Forest Department Sarawak, the Sarawak Timber Industry Corporation Development and the Sarawak Timber Association is to launch a study on this issue to resolve the downgrading of Meranti plywood.

Mr Johnny Kon, a

retired staff from Sarawak Forestry Corporation Sdn Bhd who has extensive knowledge in timber, log and standing tree identification has been employed to assist in a project. A mill and log pond survey will be carried out with the aim of gathering information on the 99 species that form the bulk of the plywood manufactured for the European market. Apart from that, he will be assigned to design and conduct the standing tree and log identification courses for the Company.

Establishments the Planted Forest Skills Sets, STAT is offering two Certificates, namely

Certificate in Clear-fell Site Preparation and Certificate in Mechanical Site Preparation (Excavator). A trainer from New Zealand, Mr Kenneth Fergusson arrived in Kuching early this year to start training for these skills sets. Mr Fergusson has vast experience in land clearance and silviculture and had worked in the Solomon Islands and New Zealand. His last three years had been spent with Industry Training Works, Carter Holt Harvey (CHH) where he worked as a trainer developing forestry skills for people entering the forest industry.

Did you know that...

According to the Global Markets for Chain-of-Custody Certified Papers study by Pira International, the global paper market is to rise by 2.3% by 2012. However, global consumption of FSC paper (certified under the Forest Stewardship Council programme) is forecast to rise by 48.7% to almost 6.5mn tons and global consumption of PEFC paper (certified under the Programme for the Endorsement of Forest Certification) is predicted to surge by 92.7% to almost 2mn tons by 2012. Demand for certified papers is forecast to grow continuously by 2012, driven mainly by demand from end consumers.

Did you also know that...

To ensure continuous high coverage of forests in Laos, a new forest protection legislation will be enforced in the country by the Forestry Department of the Ministry of Agriculture & Forestry. The law, which has 130 articles, forbids the logging, selling and buying of endangered timber species without the permission of the government, besides banning citizens from setting up homes in forest-classified areas. The legislation also covers wildlife, soil erosion, water resource, and environmental protection.
