# STA TRAINING UPDATES

The State Government had amended the Forests Ordinance (Sarawak Cap 126) in 2001 to include Section 54B, which states "No employer shall hire, engage or appoint any workman under a contract of service or of apprenticeship or under any other arrangement whatsoever, to carry out, undertake or perform any forestry activity unless that workman has successfully completed a course of training in such forestry activity which is conducted by an institution approved by the Director in consultation with the Minister...". The Association has been verbally informed by the Forest Department that the above legislation may be enforced sometime in the near future.

The State Government, through the Forest Department Sarawak, has delegated this responsibility to STA. Through its wholly-owned

company, STA Training Sdn Bhd, and with inputs from representatives from member Companies of STA. Forest the Department Sarawak and the Sarawak Forestry Corporation, the consultation process culminated in engaging the Forest Industries Training (FITEC) of New Zealand to come out with a training system to be implemented in the State. Three skill sets that had

# Did you know that...

Krisana Agarwood (Krisana), a joint venture between Malaysia-based Laksamana Resources and Thailand's Borai Krisana Partnership, is planning to expand its gaharu tree sapling market in Malaysia by offering local farmers with plantation-related services. Gaharu trees produce scented wood that contain resins or antitoxins that can be used in wide applications.

According to Krisana's Chairman, Datuk Seri Diraja Syed Razlan Jamalullail, the gaharu tree sapling industry also offers high business opportunities to growers due to its high demand. Besides, Malaysia also has a higher chance of becoming a gaharu tree exporter as the current international supply only manages to cater 35% of the total gaharu wood demand. Currently, gaharu wood is valued between RM 8,000 (US\$ 2,411.09 EUR 1,639.68) and RM 10,000 a kg.

Global debt observer Fitch Ratings (Fitch) has projected the economies of Asian countries to expand by 7.7% in 2008 compared to 8.7% in 2007. 

been offered are log extraction, tree felling and log loading.

As of 31 December 2007, a total of 110 trainers were trained and trainees are under training in the Trainer Development Programme. As for the Operator Training Programme, 127 operators had been assessed to be competent and 126 operators still under training.

STA members who do not have in-house trainers i.e those who had been trained by STAT trainers under the Trainer Development Programme are invited to nominate

potential candidates who are Malaysians, preferably with relevant hands-on skills for this Trainer Development Programme. Candidates must have at least completed primary education and physically fit for this trainer development programme. All candidates will be assessed their at camps, respective suitability to be trained as trainers. These candidates once trained, will be the in-house trainers of their companies to train operators in these skills set.

The STA Council recognises the high direct and indirect cost of training. To help offset some of the cost incurred
