Roadshow on the Implementation of the Forests (Trained Workmen) Rules, 2015

STA Training Sdn Bhd (STAT) and SARAWAK FORESTRY Corporation Sdn Bhd (SFCSB) jointly organised a series of Roadshows on the "Implementation of the Forests (Trained Workmen) Rules, 2015". Four (4) briefings had been organised in Miri on 26 April 2017, Bintulu on 27 April 2017, Sibu on 28 April 2017 and Kuching on 17 May 2017, participated by representatives from the timber industry and forestry-related agencies.

In the Briefing in Kuching, Dr Peter Kho, Manager of STAT gave a brief introduction on the background of skills training and informed all participants at the Briefing that STAT has been appointed as a Training Provider. He further sought the co-operation of both members of STA and non members to plan their training needs of their workmen to ensure they are able to comply with the requirements of both The Forests (Trained Workmen) Rules 2015 (The Rules) and Forests Ordinance 2015.

He also emphasised on the importance of skills training, types of training courses offered by STAT as well as

methods of carrying out skills training and assessments.

Ms Shirley Lyn Michael Gias, Manager Forest Industry Training, on behalf of Tuan Haii Zolkipli Mohd Aton. Acting General Manager, Strategic Planning and Special Projects Division of SFC gave a presentation on the requirement of The Rules, the responsibilities of the timber licensees or contractors as well as SFC's roles and responsibilities as an Agent. She also highlighted the consequences of non-compliance (employer and workman) under the Forests Ordinance, 2015 and The Forests (Trained Worksmen) Rules, 2015. She then presented the Standard Operating Procedures for the monitoring of compliance for both employers and workmen.

Participants at the Briefing were urged to fully understand and be aware of the requirements of Section 51(1) of The Forests Ordinance, 2015 and The Rules. Those interested to get their workmen trained are requested to contact either Dr Peter Kho or Ms Melinda Chai at 082-332222.

Did you know that.....



Three Critically Endangered Sumatran rhinos were known to survive in Malaysia. Although all 3 rhinos could not reproduce naturally, a plan to help preserve diverse genetic material for this species with low birthrates was made after a 25 years old female rhino, named Puntung was found to still produce eggs. However, the female rhino was diagnosed with terminal cancer in April 2017 and her health deteriorated rapidly that the government had authorized euthanasia to end her suffering, on 4 June 2017. Reproductive specialists are now working hard to recover any egg cells that may be present in her ovaries to contribute to the survival of her species.

A team of scientists from Switzerland has devised a cheap and effective way to split carbon dioxide into carbon monoxide and oxygen inexpensively, by using a technique of electrolysis employing copper-oxide nanowires modified with tin oxide. The solar-driven CO2 reduction, with an efficiency of 13.4% is vital for improving the efficiency of alternative forms of energy as we continue to wean ourselves off fossil fuels and transition to cleaner and greener energy while also seeking to reduce the amount of CO2 in the atmosphere.
